

Arun Singh

Ambassador Arun Singh has extensive experience across the globe, including as India's Ambassador to the United States, Israel, and France. Throughout his distinguished 37-year career in the Indian Foreign Service, Ambassador Singh has served during pivotal periods in key global capitals, and was instrumental in shaping India's policies, notably the continued progress in the US-India relationship; India's closer ties to Israel; and the formulation and implementation of India's policies related to Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Iran, including in the period following 9/11.

Ambassador Singh is currently a Visiting Professor at Ashoka University, a Distinguished Non-Resident Senior Fellow in the Asia Program at The German Marshall Fund of US and at Carnegie India. In the spring of 2017, Ambassador Singh taught courses on US Foreign Policy in South Asia and Current Global Trends and Challenges at both American University and the School of Advanced International Studies at Johns Hopkins University. He was also a Distinguished Visiting Professor at Emory University, and the Center for Advanced Study of India at the University of Pennsylvania. He was a Member of India's National Security Advisory Board over 2021-22.

Ambassador Singh holds a Masters Degree in Economics from Delhi University, where he specialized in econometrics, development policy, macroeconomics, and Indian economic history.
