

Rohit Kumar Singh is a 1989-batch IAS officer with over 35 years of experience spanning infrastructure, public finance, digital governance and institutional reform. He is best known for his six-year tenure in the highways sector, as Joint Secretary, Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, and later as Member (Finance), NHAI, where he helped revive PPP investment through the Hybrid Annuity Model and led the Toll-Operate-Transfer programme, unlocking one of India's largest FDI inflows into brownfield highway assets at the time.

He pairs this infrastructure expertise with strong technology credentials (a Master's in Computer Engineering from Clarkson University and an MPA from Harvard), which he applied as Secretary, Department of Consumer Affairs, Government of India, driving digital reforms in consumer grievance redressal, and later as a Member of the National Consumer Disputes Redressal Commission (2024–25) supporting AI-enabled dispute resolution. Earlier in his career in Rajasthan, he served as Secretary, IT and Communication, shaping the state's e-governance roadmap, and as Additional Chief Secretary, Medical and Health, where he led the state's data-driven COVID-19 response.

A regular speaker and writer on infrastructure policy, digital governance, AI regulation and public finance, Rohit brings together deep experience in project finance, regulatory design and technology-enabled public delivery, making him a distinctive voice on India's next phase of infrastructure growth.
