Deputy Chief Minister
Government of Haryana

Dushyant Chautala is a deputy chief minister of Haryana. Also, he served in as the member of Parliament from Hisar Lok Sabha Constituency representing Indian National Lok Dal. He defeated Kuldeep Bishnoi by 31,847 votes in elections. He is the youngest MP in the history of Indian Parliament in 2014. Dushyant is one of the prominent Jat leaders in the state. He is a founder of Jannayak Janata Party (JJP), which he launched after differences in the family led to his expulsion from Indian National Lok Dal.

He thrives for promotion of Education and Sports, providing maximum job opportunities for youth of our country and Preservation and promotion of culture and heritage of Haryana.

His Political Timeline is as follows

2019 - In Haryana Legislative Assembly election, Dushyant Chautala defeated BJP candidate Premlata with the margin of 47,452 votes. His party JJP also made a decent debut with victory on 10 Assembly seats.

2019 - On December 27, Dushyant Chautala took oath as a deputy chief minister of Haryana state.

2018 - After the differences in the family and his expulsion from Indian National Lok Dal, Dushyant launched the new party Jannayak Janata Party (JJP) on 9 December 2018.
