New Delhi: The grievance redressal mechanism of many big e-commerce players is not up to the mark as the number of complaints received by ation between the consumer the National Consumer Helpline has risen sharply over mar Singh said on Thursday. Addressing an event organised by the Public Affairs Forum of India (PAFI), Singh said the number of complaints registered on the National Consumer Helpline (NCH) has gone up to 90,000 in November compared to 40,000 in the same month last year.

"Four years back, the number of complaints pertaining to e-commerce transactions was 8 per cent of the total complaints. Last month, it was 48 per cent of the total complaints," he said.
